<p>Population Needs Assessment & Local SMART goal</p>	<p>Sydney Turner shared information on the new Population Needs Assessment, which is a collaboration with other plans and local health department to identify the priority needs of the community. Tina Hendizadeh (Service Coordination Liaison) shared Los Angeles's SMART goal with the committee and requested feedback – From January 2024-December 2025, all county health plans including HN will collaborate with the LHDs (there are 3) to implement strategies to reduce maternal and infant mortality disparities for Black and Native American members in LA county by 50%.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Committee suggested gym memberships as a beneficial intervention for pregnant women. • Suggested improved understanding of special needs among healthcare providers (OBGYNs, hospitals) to facilitate better care. 	<p>N/A</p>	<p>N/A</p>
