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Los Angeles Wildfire Impact on Schools:

Hazel Health provides telehealth services for more than 1.3 million students in Los Angeles County. If you have been affected by the recent wildfires, there are several financial aid resources available to help manage expenses and continue your education:

Provides grants and loans for recovery after a disaster declaration, including housing repair or rental assistance.

Centers will be open in
Los Angeles County to assist
Californians who experienced
damage to their primary home,
personal property loss or have
disaster-caused emergency
needs related to the wildfires.
At the center, people can get help
applying for federal assistance,
speak to representatives from
state and federal agencies, receive
updates on their FEMA application
for assistance and learn about the
appeals process.
